WASTEWATER SYSTEM NAMED VIRGINIA'S BEST

In April, the Coeburn-Norton-Wise (C-N-W) Regional Wastewater Treatment Authority was named the Virginia Rural Water Association 2017 Wastewater System of the Year.

"This was a teamwork achievement," C-N-W Executive Director Mark Hollyfield said, reflecting on the award given at the conclusion of the association's annual conference in Roanoke.

The Lane Group/CHA/T+L Team was commissioned by C-N-W for Permitting, Design, and Construction Administration for the expansion and upgrade of the existing 4.0 MGD Wastewater Plant to a capacity of 6.5 MGD. Funding for the project was provided by the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (VDEQ). The project was completed in March 2015.

FEATURED PROJECT

CLIFFVIEW COMMUNITY WATER PROJECT: TLG is very pleased with the opportunity to continue providing professional engineering services to the Carroll County Public Service Authority (PSA). TLG was commissioned by the PSA for the development of a Preliminary Engineering Report and funding application then to complete final design and provide construction administration for water service extensions to the Cliffview area in Western Carroll County.

Construction was divided into two separate contracts. Contract I included approximately 53,780 LF of 8” and smaller water line and related improvements. Contract II included construction of one (1) 85,000 gallon water storage tank, access road, approximately 1,080 LF of 8” water line, and related improvements.

Total project cost was \$3,091,000 with funding assistance from USDA-Rural Development and the Mount Rogers Planning District Commission.
